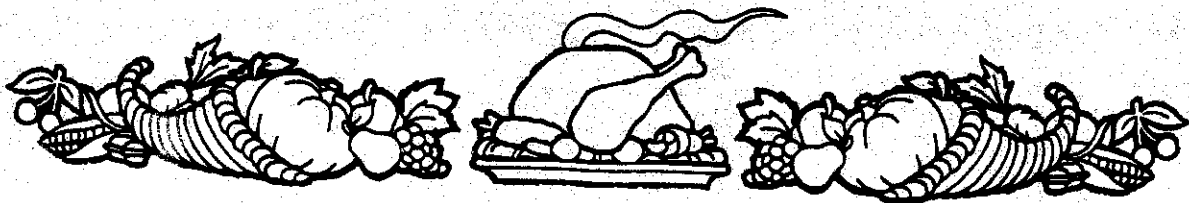

WILLIS POINT RATEPAYER'S ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE MEETING Sept. 11, 1989

PRESENT: Barry Peeke-Vout, Gillian Jackson, Dianne Twamley, Jan Chapman, Carmen Moore, Bob Halsey, Alan Cracknell, Sam Young, Ida von Schuckmann, Lois Lovo, Gloria Graham, Sydnie Bonner, Joan McCandless, Dave Carley

Meeting called to order at 7:35 pm.

1. Minutes of the April 24, 1989 meeting were read. Moved by Alan Cracknell. 2nd by Carmen Moore to adopt as read. Carried.

2. Treasurer's Report: Alan Cracknell reported a balance of \$7,553.01. (Financial Report attached) Moved by Alan Cracknell. 2nd by Dave Carley to adopt as read. Carried.

3. Fire Committee & Recreation Commission Report: Gloria Graham reported that the Commission/Committee met Sept. 5, 1989. She confirmed a piano had been purchased for \$1,200.00 from Dan Walker. This is \$200.00 over the allotted funds so Fire Committee is going to put on a Pub Night with proceeds to the shortfall and maintenance. The Fire Committee had previously voted to provide \$500.00 of the original \$1,000 allocated for the piano. \$500 will be transferred from the Fire Committee to the WPRA. Gloria Graham moved. Dianne Twamley 2nd. Motion carried.

A "Thank you" letter will be forwarded to Dan Walker as the piano is an excellent deal.

Piano Pub Night is slated for Nov. 18. Fire Committee expressed deep concern about the amount of vandalism and theft taking place at Willis Point. The ambulance shed window was broken and a 6V battery stolen from the shed. This battery was only good for an older vehicle such as the old fire truck #101 which the WP Firefighters Assoc. is in the process of restoring. The outdoor electrical outlets at the hall have also been vandalised.

Gary Butchart resigned as Chairman of the Fire Committee. Pat Sloan is the new Chairman.

The Fire Committee budget meeting is Oct. 16.

4. Membership Report: Carmen Moore reported three new members to the WPRPA:

- Paul & Louise Walker
- Paul & Pat Williams

5. The Pointer Report: Jan Chapman suggested that we set a date for the 4 Pointer editions and have deadlines for submission of articles. Left to Jan Chapman as editor to select publishing dates:

1. Early November: Please submit articles now
2. February
3. Early May: month before Hilltopper
4. Mid-Aug.: Reminding WPR of AGM in Sept.

If there is not enough material for a full-sized edition Jan will publish a news bulletin.

6. Road Report: On Aug,23, 1989 Barry Peeke-Vout phoned Neville Hope in the design office at the Ministry of Transportation and Highways, He is in charge of the new road. Mr. Hope stated that the new road has not yet gone to tender. Provincial Govt is waiting for the federal treasury to approve the \$1.5M which is DND's portion of the new road budget. Neville Hope will advise WPRA when road construction is to start. Barry will contact Mr. Hope to try to arrange a representative from the Ministry Of Highways to attend the AGM.

Sam Young has written to Mof H&T re\;heritage hemlock and marked it with a ribbon so that engineers will ensure that the tree will not be damaged or removed during road construction.

7. Municipal Status: Alan Cracknell wrote to Corp. of Saanich for results of amalgamation study that they did. No response. Phoned - no response. He will leave for 1 more month and then do follow-up.

Barry Peeke-Vout read letter from Ministry of Municipal Affairs to G.Wheeler of Corp. of Central Saanich. The Ministry of Municipal Affairs would consider grant for feasibility study of amalgamation of Willis Point but more information is required.

Barry Peeke-Vout then read letter from Kelly Gesner of Fama Holdings Ltd. stating that Fama will be petitioning Central Saanich to incorporate their property and requesting Willis Point feeling about joining them in the petition action, or separately? or at all?

Upon receipt of the letter Barry Peeke-Vout immediately phoned Kelly Gesner of Fama. She said forget the letter, their plans have completely changed. They will not be petitioning Central Saanich for amalgamation. She stated that Fama will be going forward with the Central Saanich portion of the development but remaining property in CRD will be long term project.

It was suggested that Rick Kaspar, our Director at CRD be invited to AGM for questions concerning WPRatepayers and Fama Holdings Ltd.

8. Social Events: Social Committee feels they are redundant. Sydnie Bonner mangaes the hall, Carmen Moore the new members.

Suggested that re-institute follow-up reports from groups putting on events at the hall so that guidelines will be available to new groups wishing to present Happy Hours etc. re: Price Lists

9. Highland Area Review Committee: Gloria Graham reported that the Highland Area Review Committee has hired consultants Michael Bockington and Grant Copeland. On Sept. 16 the committee will be meeting with the consultants to decide the format for the questionnaires and open houses for the residents of the Highlands to input their ideas for the future of the Highlands.

Unfinished Business:

Quiet Lane: The unfinished status has been mentioned to Rick Kaspar. He said to get estimate for cost to complete and send in request for grant to CRD. An estimate is being sought.

Picnic Tables: Lack of maintenance and weathering breaks them down. Are they really required? Bob Halsey suggested that if the WPRA is going to purchase tables that they should perhaps purchase good interior tables, to be moved outdoors when required. At this year's Hilltopper there were adequate tables. Decided to do nothing about purchasing tables at this time, if more required in the future, will consider purchase at that time.

Playground: Nothing to report. Kathy Ilott will be contacted to attend the AGM and report on the status of the playground.

Complaints received regarding damage to park and playground by motorbikes. Dianne Twamley volunteered to deal with this issue.

Signs: Barry Peeke-Vout will again contact Royal Oak Highways office regarding signs.

"NO THRU ROAD" sign anonymously acquired will be anonymously posted at the start of Willis Point Road.

Hartland Road Landfill: Landfill fumes seem to be worsening in the Willis Point area. Decided to send letter to CRD re: worsening side effects of the Hartland Road Landfill with copies to the Prospect Lake Community Assoc. and Rick Kaspar, CRD Director.

Derelict Vehicles: seems to be an improvement. Thank you.

Fire Hazard re: Unauthorized Gatherings: In response to our letters to RCMP and Fama Holdings Ltd. expressing concern about fires and parties:

1. Fama has posted sign "No Trespassing" at road to their property near Sea Aira Heights.

2. RCMP has replied by letter that they are diligently watching for unauthorized gatherings in the area. They requested that we pass on to Willis Pointers that "please do not hesitate to report any suspicious activity in the area."

New Business:

1. Letter received stating the fees for registering the Society now \$15.00.

2. Nominating committee required for elections at AGM for 4 positions vacant:
1. Corresponding Secretary
 2. Member-At-Large
 3. Membership Secretary
 4. Vice-Chairman

Dianne Twamley will chair the nominating committee.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Minutes: of Sept. 19, 1988 AGM were read. Moved by Joan McCandless. 2nd by Vern McConnell to adopt as read. Carried.

2. Road Report: Guests for Dept of Highways and Willis, Cunliffe & Tait were introduced.

Allan Davidson stated that property negotiations were underway with federal government. Assistant Deputy Minister of Highways was handling negotiations for province and they were close to agreement. He thought approx. 1 month to finalize. Prov. of BC Treasury is committed and only awaiting federal govt commitment. Corp. of Saanich expressed concern about Wallace Drive. Decided it will be widened and improved which will add to project time. Go ahead date is late Nov. unless unforeseen "road blocks" with federal govt negotiations.

Questions from the floor:

1. Completion date hopefully late summer 1990.
2. Land is unsettled in DND section. Fill must sit 6 months.

3. Parking lot on south side of Durrance Lake is at request of CRD - not necessarily to be built by Dept. of Highways.
4. Heritage hemlock tree- it is marked on plan. Dept of Hwys is aware of it. Please mark with ribbon.
5. Construction will start at east end (DND) because rock fill required for access.
6. DND will be doing own clearing of land - to start in Oct.
7. CRD leachate pipe will run down easement of new road to join up at Wallace Drive.

WPRA requested copy of road plan posted on wall. Dept of Hwys said would forward one.

Rick Kaspar said blight on road if access to Hartland Road Landfill by new road. Suggested WPRA send strong letter to CRD expressing our concerns of utilising new road for future access to Hartland Rd. Landfill.

Dept of Hwys received plan with pencilled in notation "possible future access" from Tom Lidtke of CRD Engineering Dept.

2. Treasure's Report (attached)

Allan Cracknell reported that WPRA is in very good shape thanks mainly to excellent Hilltopper.

Suggestion for the floor to invest some funds in term deposit. Under advisement.

Moved by Allan Cracknell. 2nd Carmen Moore to adopt as read. Carried.

Membership REport: Carmen Moore reported that there were nine new members for a total of 118 households.

5. Fire Committe & REcreation Commission Report:

Gary Butchart gave brief history of the Fire Commission. A 1975 By-law established the comission and its function. It is a 2 year appointment to commission by the CRD. Chairperson is chosen by the 7 members. Basically its function is to establish a budget. Required to meet once a year, but do meet more frequently to deal with issues.

A 1986 By-Law established a committee of 7 to manage Fire Dept and appoint Fire Chief. It is the method to transfer authority from the CRD to the Fire Department to function in role of fire protection. To streamline - same members on Fire Committee and Recreation Commission.

WPRA pays Committee/Commission \$3,200 annually for the use of the hall. Fire Chief is non-voting member of Committee/Commission. For appointment to Committee/Commission submit name to chairperson or in writing to CRD.

6. Fire Department Report: Deputy Chief Bill Wright reported that there were 25 members.

Requested that residents of Willis Point please make house numbers readable at night. Assists greatly when Fire Dept required to make an emergency call.

There have been 2 breakins to ambulance shed & 2 6V batteries stolen. the Fire Dept is offering a reward for information concerning the breakins.

7. Pointer Report: Jan Chapman - please try to have articles and submissions to Jan immediately while details are fresh in your mind rather than procrastinating until the Pointer is due (or overdue) and Jan is required to make followup phone calls.

8. Municipal Status Report: Alan Cracknell wrote to Corp of Saanich and Corp of Central Saanich on Feb 6, 1989 as suggested by Ministry of Municipal Affairs. REquested these municipalities consider annexation of the Willis Point area.

Saanich said would refer to staff. We have yet to receive additional response from Saanich.

Barry Peeke-Vout, Alan Cracknell, Lois Lovo and Karen Scott met informally with Central Saanich council. Just gave background of why we were approaching them.

Rick Kaspar stated that Sooke will be meeting with CRD about incorporating. This will change status of Langford - cannot support CRD alone. Willis Point will not be allowed to remain unorganized, it must be allied with some district. Rick Kaspar said he would support the wishes of the residents of Willis Point.

9. Social Committee Report: Ida von Schuckmann reported that committee would like to act as information gathering service for social functions. If any residents wish to put on an event at the hall and have questions - please contact a member of the social committee:

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Bob McMinn, Chairman of Langford Advisory Planning Commission spoke. Soil survey of Highlands area is now completed, so committee set up to review Highland Area Plan.

Peter Robbins - Durrance Lake
Val Fletcher - East Highlands
Rose Nicoll - South Highlands
Bob McMinn - West Highlands

CRD provided \$10,000 to hire outside consultant to review Highlands Area Community Plan. This review is to get input from residents for the future of the Highlands.

The review committee hired consultants Michael Bockington and Grant Copeland to develop the plan. They will be drawing up a leaflet and questionnaire to go out to Highland residents in November. Open houses will be held:

Nov 27: Willis Point Community Hall
28: Pike House
29: East Highlands Firehall
Dec 2: Morning: Willis Point Hall
Afternoon: Pike House

From input received at these open houses and completed questionnaires, consultants will prepare a draft plan. Draft plan will be presented to public for discussion and amendments. From this information the final Highlands area Community Plan will be submitted to the CRD for inclusion in the Langford Area Plan.

Hopefully the committee will have a completed Plan to submit by March 1990.

Please take an active role in submitting your ideas to the committee.

2. Fama Holdings Ltd: Kelly Cooper, Project Manger for Fama requested an informal meeting with the WPRa executive. At that time she reported that studies are being done, no decisions had been made.

As of last Wed. Central Saanich made clear to Fama that major money for water and sewer must be put up before any development done in Central Saanich and if Fama was contemplating developing the Highlands, water and sewer through Central Saanich is major monetary consideration.

Lorraine Pommen and Dave Price reported that Fama wishing Willis Point residents to know that the "NO Trespassing" signs are for outsiders. Willis Point residents are to feel free to access their property.

3. Playground: Kathy Ilott reported that \$600 in the bank and an additional \$600 is available to construct a playground. Volunteers needed - a list was passed around for willing people to sign up. Kathy Ilott will also look into additional funding from lottery grants and CRD.

11. Other Business:

Art Jackson reported on the 911 system now in place.

If the batteries in a cordless phone are low it can misdial.

Uwe Pause bought up issue of poor road maintenance on Willis Point Rd. and Durrance Rd. Erosion of road between sentries is worsening and road up Canyon Hill falling away. Letter expressing concern will be forwarded to firm doing road maintenance.

Rick Kaspar mentioned Dr. Tony Boydell hired by CRD as consultant on dealing with liquid waste in CRD.

Suggested letter be forwarded to Wayne Watkins, Chairman - Regional Parks Committee expressing WP residents concern that the parking lot on southside of lake will be a congregating area for parties. Perhaps new parking lot for hikers should be moved to junction of Pease Lake and Durrance Lake.

Concern expressed about dangerous discharge of firearms by hunters in the area. If seen or heard, please report to RCMP.

Meeting moved to adjourn at 10:00 pm. Moved Kathy Ilott. 2nd Joel Cotter. Carried.

INTERVIEW WITH TONY BOYDELL - by Ken Leighton

As I look up at the construction trailers which are temporary home of the Boydells, I ponder a few questions.

As most Willis Pointers know, Tony is the Commissioner appointed by the Capitol Regional District to develop a liquid waste management plan for the CRD - a hot potato for sure.

Tony came to Canada in 1968 after completing a geography degree in Manchester, England. In Calgary he took his Master of Science degree and a PHD in Quaternary geology (recent geological period).

Tony has held senior positions with the BC Ministry of Environment (Waste Management Programme), and was Regional Director General with Environment Canada. Most recently he did a study on the transport of dangerous goods in Vancouver.

Bernadette and Tony both feel that Willis Point is at the crossroads as far as development is concerned. They value the isolation and friendly community spirit which we have and feel that large scale development would spoil this. If we can keep a low density we should be able to maintain our clean environment and freedom from the uglier aspects of urban living.

Another of Tony's concerns is the Hartland Dump which is being covered over in the next few years. This cover will not stop the escape of the gases which are causing the unpleasant odour. Our new road will pass very close to Heal Lake which will be drained and filled with garbage over the next 30 years.

Tony's other interests include running marathons, and the ultra-marathon, a fifty mile trail race. He also runs the really difficult one - the Hilltopper.

Both Bernadette and Tony belong to the Willis Point Volunteer Fire Department. Tony is especially interested in developing a Willis Point Emergency Response plan in case of a major earthquake.

Tony, Bernadette, Justin, Oliver, Rachel and the two cats are looking forward to getting into their new home by January 15th.

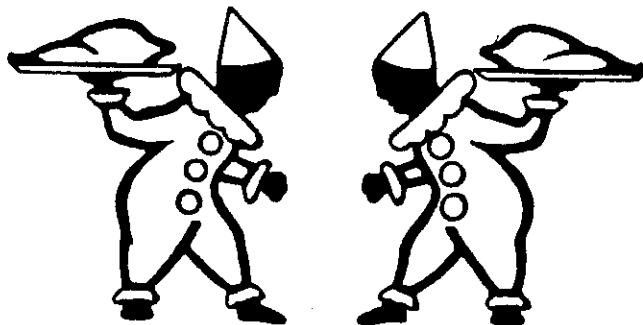

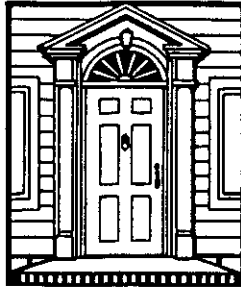

It was very good to see the professionalism and seriousness with which this exercise was approached and executed. We can be truly proud of our department.

Of course a word of thanks to the Langford fire department must not be forgotten. Without their invite, this would have been just another quiet sunday.
