WPRA news

WILLIS POINT RATEPAYER'S ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, MINUTES - OCTOBER 5, 1992

Meeting called to order at 7:45pm 44 members present.

Minutes of the last AGM were adopted as correct by Ken Leighton and seconded by Karen Scott. Carried.

Report of the Chair

Tony Boydell noted that all minutes and events are presented in the Pointer. The CRD intends to develop a composting facility at the Hartland Landfill near Willis Point Road. Construction will begin in 1993. Compost carrying trucks will be using Willis Point Road. Initial plans are for yard waste organic materials and in the future other compostable material will be accommodated.

Tony thanked the people who have donated valuable volunteer service to the community especially Gaybrielle Halsey and her committee for their efforts building the tennis court and playground, Alison Cracknell for organizing Kid's Nights and the Emergency Preparedness Program, Peter Gary for his garbage clean-up initiative, and Bernadette Boydell for keeping the community informed through the Pointer. A special vote of thanks went out to Dave Carley for 16 years of dedicated service building a strong and important fire department.

Treasurer's Report

Alan Cracknell presented his report and explained that aerobics fees go into a fund to pay for electricity and incidentals at the hall. They do not go through WPRA funds. Tennis court bills are paid through the CRD so they have an accounting of what happens on their land. Don Gorling moved to adopt the treasurer's report correct as presented, seconded by Ken Ilott. Carried.

Alan Cracknell moved that \$5,000 from the general fund be put in a 180 day deposit. Seconded by Don Gorling. Carried. We agreed to loan the tennis and playground fund up to \$5,000 to complete the facility until the GO BC grant funds come through.

Membership

Jill Stevens noted seven new memberships so far in 1992.

Fire Committee and Recreation Commission

Pat Sloan, interim Chair, reported that this body is purely administrative and sets the budget for the Hall and the Fire Department. Pat announced that Vern McConnell had been elected Fire Chief and thanked Dave Carley for 16 years of leadership. Those who are interested in sitting on the Fire Committee and Recreation Commission should forward a letter of interest to Pat Sloan. At least one, and possibly two positions will be vacant soon. The Commission will be deciding how to choose new members.

Fire Department

New Fire Chief, Vern McConnell, reported 26 active members, most of whom have attended the fire school in Colwood. Willis Point is fire-conscious and well built so we have had few fires. The department has erected and maintains a Fire Hazard sign near Durrance Lake. Fire practices are held every Wednesday night at 7:45pm and are open to anyone who is interested. A first aid and CPR course will soon be scheduled in our community.

Tennis Court and Playground

Gaybrielle Halsey thanked the many people in the community who helped with the tennis court construction. At least 972 volunteer hours were worked. The court is basically finished now and the playground will be completed in the spring. About \$27,000 has been spent, \$ 4,000 is in hand to complete the playground, and upon completion, GO BC will give us the \$ 5,000 still owed.

Quiet Lane

It will probably cost about \$1,000 for rocks and cement to develop Quiet Lane to a level where non-trailer boats can be safely launched. Quiet Lane is public property under the Department of Highways. Questions were raised regarding our liability, the possible need to apply for foreshore rights and maintenance of the ramp. It was suggested a set of steps might be as effective as a ramp. Ken Leighton moved that we spend up to \$1,000 to improve Quiet Lane to small boat launch capability. Seconded by Clive Farmer. Carried. Brian McCandless will join a committee to facilitate this and we need someone to coordinate the committee. Anyone interested, please contact Brian.

Tree Removal Around the Hall

The trees shed onto the roof of the Hall, the debris dams the water which then runs back up under the metal roofing. Gutters should be maintained on a regular basis or four or five trees topped to ease maintenance. The alders are encroaching on the playground and field. Should they be cut back to the line of the original forest? Both matters were referred to the Fire Committee and Recreation Commission for recommendations and perhaps a public meeting.

Budget for 1992-1993

Alan Cracknell presented a proposed budget for the coming year. Alison Cracknell and Karen Scott will check into purchasing a new dishwasher for the Hall. Allocation of funds is in the hands of the elected Executive and the Fire Committee and Recreation Committee.

Election of Officers

Nominating officer Ken Leighton reported that there was no nomination for Chair so Vice-Chair Don Gorling will step in and act as interim Chair. Treasurer Alan Cracknell and Recording Secretary Pat Williams were both elected by acclamation for another term. Connie McInnis and Denise Tregear were elected to the two Member-at-Large positions. Fuzz Cracknell moved to destroy the ballots. Seconded by Don Gorling. Carried. Don Gorling took over the meeting and thanked out-going Chair Tony Boydell and Members-at-Large Lorraine Pommen and Ken Leighton for their service.

New Business

We will ask the owner of the old van on Mark Lane to have it removed. Don Gorling will inquire about having the yellow line repainted on the road as soon as possible before the fog comes. Parking on Mark Lane would sometimes make it difficult to get an emergency vehicle to the end of the road. It was noted that the Fire Department is authorized to remove anything in its way by whatever means in an emergency. Residents and visitors are encouraged to park well off the road. A notice regarding parking will appear in the Pointer.

Alison Cracknell will organize a kitchen clean-up and inventory at the Hall. Ken Ilott will organize a clean-up of the crawl space at 10:00am October 31, 1992. Refuse will be burnt on the Halloween bonfire and any good items could be sold at the next Hilltopper auction.

The status of renters in the Ratepayer's Association will be addressed at the next Executive meeting.

Ken Leighton has done some interviews for a Willis Point history and Alison Cracknell is also interested.

We have been offered a double deep fryer for free, the only cost would be to hook it up. The Executive will pursue this.

There was some discussion about spending limitations for the Executive but it was generally felt that as elected officials the Executive should control financial decisions and that it would be too cumbersome if everything has to go to general meetings.

At 10:50pm Ken Ilott moved to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Bob Scott. Carried.

EXECUTIVE MEETING, MINUTES - NOVEMBER 2, 1992**

Present: Chair, Don Gorling, Alan Cracknell, Connie McInnis, Denise Tregear, Alison Cracknell, Vern McConnell, Jill Stevens, Pat Williams.

The meeting called to order at 7:40pm. Minutes of the last meeting were adopted as correct by Alan Cracknell and seconded by Jill Stevens and carried. Minutes from the AGM were adopted as correct by Connie McInnis, seconded by Alison Cracknell and carried.

Report of the Chair

Don Gorling is the acting chairman, an interim position, until the next General Meeting and then it is hoped a chair can be elected or appointed. Member-at-Large Denise Tregear will fill the position of acting Vice-Chair.

The following issues will be addressed as soon as possible: Members-at-Large projects for upgrading the Hall; continued fund raising (Casinos and Hilltopper); interested people to fill vacant executive positions; continuing development of the Emergency Preparedness Program; and Quiet Lane and Playground development. Don also suggested monthly rather than quarterly Executive meetings and an Executive-sponsored Happy Hour.

Treasurer's Report

Alan Cracknell reported a general fund balance of \$8,224.59 the tennis and playground fund has \$4,241.19 and the gaming account has \$60.76. The Treasurer's report was adopted correct by Alison Cracknell and seconded by Connie McInnis. Carried.

Membership

Jill reported no new members. She will update the old membership list and give copies to the Membership Committee.

Fire Committee and Recreation Commission

A member of this group should be invited to all our meetings. Vern McConnell outlined the budget of the Commission in detail. Arrangements have been made for a gravity feed 20,000 gallon holding tank to be installed near the Hall. The fire trucks can be quickly filled from there.

Other Business

A Special General Meeting will be called to vote on the proposal for renters' status and to fill the vacant Executive positions. Names and phone numbers of the Executive and their duties will be published in the Pointer. We established a schedule for monthly meetings and this will also be published in the Pointer. A copy of our bylaws will be made available to all Executive.

Emergency Preparedness

Long term planning as well as networking with other areas has begun. We have to apply for funding through the CRD. The end result will be a comprehensive community plan. Alison Cracknell will keep the community informed through the Pointer.

Dishwasher

Alison Cracknell will order a new dishwasher for the Hall. The old one will be offered for sale. Some ideas about streamlining the bar and the food service areas of the Hall were discussed. Alison Cracknell will organize a kitchen cleanup and inventory.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:20pm

Fire Chief's Notes

- 1 The WPVFD has a current enrollment of 24 personnel. This leaves two or three vacancies for new members. New applicants should be physically fit, have an alert mind, and be able to devote three to four hours each week to training. Involvement in the WPVFD is the ultimate in community commitment - a commitment to the safeguarding of your neighbours their homes and families.
- 2 The WPVFD has recently been offered a 20,000 gallon water tank. This is free gratis the only proviso is that we must transport it to Willis Point ourselves. It measures 13 feet in diameter and 33 feet high. Positioned in proximity to the fire hall it will provide an invaluable source of water in the fighting of fire in your community. The WPVFD is currently working on the challenge of lifting and transporting it from its current location on Millstream Road. Should any community member be able to offer technical or monetary assistance please contact me at 652-2996 or 386-8778.
- 3 Fire apparatus (trucks) are some of the largest and heaviest vehicles on the road. Roads at Willis Point are extremely narrow and hazardous. Residents and their

guests should be aware that they must leave the roads clear and accessible so that large vehicles can pass. A fire truck travelling to a fire with 1,200 gallons of water on board is difficult to manoeuvre and any vehicle parked on the roadway would come off second best.
