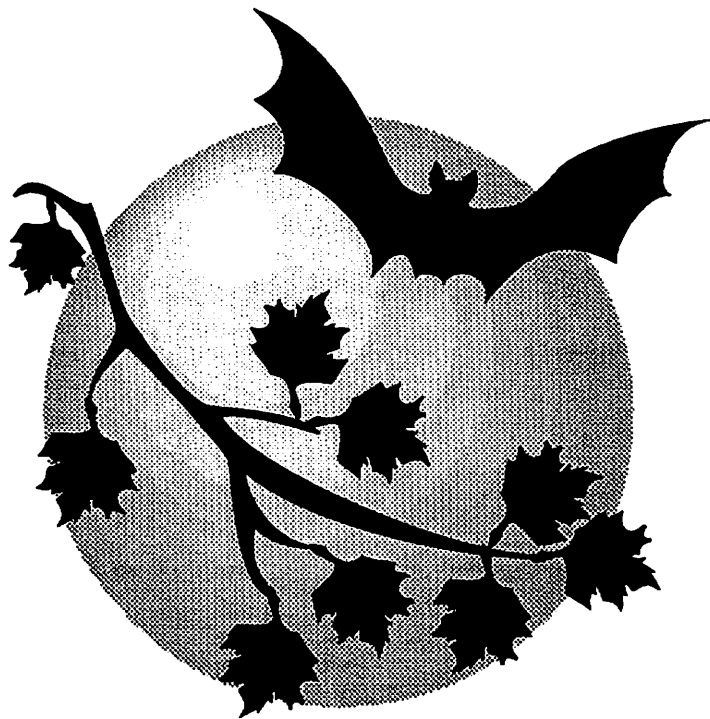

FIRE PROTECTION COMMITTEE/RECREATION COMMISSION

NOTICE

The Fire Protection Committee and Recreation Commission (the "Commission", as it is usually called) is an official body made up of seven Willis Point property owners appointed by the CRD to act on the CRD's behalf. Their prime objective is to establish and maintain a budget to cover the Willis Point Volunteer Fire Department operating costs and the costs of running and maintaining the recreation hall and paying the mortgage. It is purely an administrative committee and there are no political involvements. The current members at the commission are: Gloria Graham, Patricia Sloan, Bob Halsey, Gary Butchart, Sydney Bonner, Bob Scott, Joan McCandless and the CRD Regional Director Dave Dalby. The WPVFD Chief, Dave Carley is also a member (non voting). The number of meetings per year is dependant upon the concerns and issues to resolve or discuss. The principal meeting of the year is held each October when the budget is prepared for the following year.

As of December 1992, there will be at least one vacant position on the Commission. Terms are for two years. If any property owner in Willis Point wishes to serve on the Commission, please forward a letter of interest to Patricia Sloan by November 1st, 1992.

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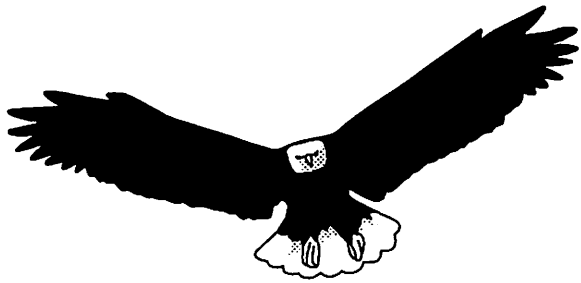

WILLIS POINT RATEPAYER'S ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE MEETING - SEPTEMBER 14, 1992

Meeting called to order at 7:45pm

Present: Chair: Tony Boydell, Jill Stevens, Alan Cracknell, Lorraine Pommen, Alison Cracknell, Bob Halsey, Gaybrielle Halsey, Dave Carley, Lois Lovo, Pat Williams.

Minutes of the last meeting were adopted as correct by Tony Boydell and seconded by Bob Halsey.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

Quiet Lane - Bob Halsey reported that it needs a few truckloads of rock and a truckload of cement to make it small boat accessible. The projected cost is about \$1,000. Quiet Lane is designated no parking, fire access, tow away zone, public access. We will look for an interested person to organize the upgrading.

Hall Tree-topping - The gutters on the Hall should be cleaned out every month or so or the trees around the Hall should be topped. The build-up of debris could cause water damage. About four trees near the Hall need to be topped below the level of the peak of the roof. This will be brought up at the AGM.

Roadside Garbage - Tony wrote to CRD regarding our garbage problem, asking for assistance for garbage disposal if we pick it up. So far there has been no response from the CRD. Tony will send the letter again.

The call for Fire Committee and Recreation Commission members will be in this Pointer.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The fire protection issue has been sorted out and is in place. Vandalism is down generally but the Hall was broken into recently.

TENNIS COURT AND PLAYGROUND REPORT

Tennis Court - A work party will finish around the bottom of the fencing, the volleyboard will go up for tennis and lacrosse practice. Basketball hoops will be put up at two different heights to accommodate children of all ages. Lines and a foul circle will be painted a different colour from the tennis lines. There will be spectator benches along the side.

Playground - The low spots in the field will be filled in and grass seed planted so the site will be ready for the playground in the spring. Many components for the playground have already been gathered. Hardware is needed for the log, chain and tire structure. Go BC still owes us \$5,500 which they will release to us upon completion of the playground. The committee would like to use WPRA money up to \$5,500 to complete the playground and then reimburse the WPRA when the GO BC money is forwarded. The playground will be built on a base of hog fuel for safety.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Alan Cracknell submitted the Treasurer's report which contains a proposed budget for 1992-1993. Lois Lovo moved to accept the Treasurer's report correct as presented. Seconded by Jill Stevens. Carried. Alan Cracknell moved to put \$5,000 on a 180 day term deposit. Seconded by Dave Carley. Carried. Alan Cracknell moved that pending the final installment of the Go BC grant, the general fund of the WPRA be authorized to advance a sum of money not exceeding \$ 5,500 for the completion of the playground. Seconded by Lois Lovo. Carried.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Jill Stevens reported 2 new memberships. Renters will be approached to see if they would like to receive the Pointer. Jill will make a new ratepayer's list.

EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS

Alison Cracknell organized a video presentation and talk given by Dick Reynolds on June 18. A questionnaire will go out with the Pointer to get ideas and community input and then work will begin on a community plan. Interested people are invited to join the committee. Contact Alison Cracknell. Networking has started as well as inquiries into funding. There will be an article in the Pointer.

Tony Boydell moved that the WPRA endorse the formation of the Willis Point Emergency Preparedness Committee. Seconded by Alan Cracknell. Carried.

Alan Cracknell moved that up to \$100 be made available for printing and other incidental expenses of the WPEPC. Seconded by Pat Williams. Carried.

HARTLAND SURPLUS LANDS

The CRD has set aside 458 acres adjoining the dump site and Mt. Work Park which can be used by the people of the CRD. A committee is presently deciding how to best use this land. So far it appears that multiple use will be encouraged, no motorized vehicles will be allowed, and that use will be compatible with Mt. Work Park. If anyone in the community has suggestions for use, contact Pat Williams.

FAMA HOLDINGS/CRD PARK ACQUISITION

The CRD has proposed trying to buy some of the Fama property to include it in Mt. Work Park. WPRA has been invited to join the committee looking at this. Funding is the major problem. Tony Boydell moved that we get in touch with Geoff Ward to express our interest in the project but that we are not interested in paying for it. Seconded by Dave Carley. Carried.

BAMBERTON UPDATE

The CRD held a public information meeting on the evening of September 2, 1992. A sustainable community is planned to be built over 20 years which will respect the local environment,

create a local economy and a sense of community. There will be three neighbourhoods and a town centre, encompassing all levels of housing and retail outlets all within five minutes walking distance. A park will be created at McCurdy Point. 50 percent of the property will remain in green space. Traffic and visual impact studies are being conducted for the projected community of 12,000.

AGM

The position of chairman, treasurer, secretary and two members-at-large will be up for election.

We will obtain a copy of the constitution for review at the AGM. Alan Cracknell moved that we adjourn the meeting at 10:30pm. Seconded by Dave Carley. Carried.

We on the committee, have been pleased to see so many different people using the court.

MONEY

At the moment, we have a little over \$4,000.00 in the bank and \$5,500.00 to come from the GO BC grant. We do not get this \$5,500.00 until the playground is completed. At the AGM, we will ask the WPRA if we can borrow this amount of money, as we need it to finish construction and repay it when we get the grant. Another casino licence has also been applied for.

We have been paying bills through the CRD for two reasons. Firstly the court and playground are on CRD property and we want to have it assessed and insured properly. Secondly we save three percent on the GST. Money goes to the area budget, in other words, to all taxpayers.

Anyone willing to volunteer on any (or all!) of these projects will be welcomed with open arms! Especially in the spring when we will have a lot of hands-on work to do.

We would like to thank the committee members, their spouses, and the many willing workers who have contributed so much to the construction of this recreation facility.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS FOR WILLIS POINT

On June 18, 1992 Mr. Dick Reynolds Volunteered his time to speak to the Willis Point community on Emergency Preparedness in case of disaster, such as an earthquake. Mr. Reynolds is the Chairman of Greater Victoria Emergency Coordination Committee and Area Coordinator of the Peninsula Emergency Measures Organization.

Approximately 25 people attended the meeting. A video was shown on how to prepare at home in case of disaster, brochures were handed out, and discussion followed.

A Committee will be formed from those interested and we will meet to discuss the following:

- 1) Prepare your Family and Home
 - Brochures available as a guideline
- 2) Community Plan
 - Willis Point Emergency Program (WPEP)
 - First Aid Courses
- 3) Reception Centre Kit
 - Central Location prepared
 - ie: first aid, communications, food, shelter, etc.

A Community plan may take years to be in place. The WPEP Committee will meet with people experienced in such preparation:

- 1) Willis Point Volunteer Fire Department
-firefighter acting as liaison for the committee to get/give advice, and keep the department up to date.
- 2) Willis Point Ratepayer's Association
-to keep the community informed and for the WPEP to report to.
- 3) Greater Victoria Emergency Coordination Committee
-Guidance from experienced people such as Mr. Reynolds.

Preparing your family is the first step - which is up to you. The WPEP Committee will work on preparing the community - which is up to all of us - working together.

We will keep everyone informed of meeting dates, and encourage all pointers to attend. Communication is important, so as a committee we will keep you up to date.

FUNDING

In the event the community decides that we require equipment to be adequately prepared for a major disaster (ie: Communications equipment such as radios, water tanks for drinking water, first aid equipment etc.) there is a joint Provincial/Federal program available to draw funds from. (The Joint Emergency Preparedness Program). Depending on the extent of our program, we may want to make application for such funds. The program details and requirements are now being looked into. Community funding may also be required if the community decides it is necessary.

WILLIS POINT EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS (WPEP)

Be prepared, not scared

The purpose of the following information is to help assist the community adversely affected by a disaster such as an earthquake, fire, etc.
